PROGRAMME

- ✓ 1. **Maiden Four-oared Inrigged Gigs.**—Distance, 1 mile. Prize, £8 and Trophies.
2. **Senior Four-oared Outriggers** (Amateur Championship of N.Z.)—Distance, 2 miles. First Prize, £30 and U.S.S. Co.'s Cup, the Young Trophy, and Four Gold Medals; second, £8; third, £4. Six boats to start or no third prize.
- ✓ 3. **Junior Four-oared Outriggers.**—Distance, 1½ miles. First Prize, £10; second, £2. Four boats to start or no second prize.
4. **Senior Double Sculls** (Amateur Championship of N.Z.) Distance, 1½ miles. Prize, £8 and Two Gold Medals.
5. **Senior Four-oared Inrigged Gigs.**—Distance, 2 miles. First Prize, £15; second, £3. Four boats to start or no second prize.
- ✓ 6. **Ladies' Plate, Four-oared Outriggers.**—For crews not rowing in race No. 2. Distance, 2 miles. First prize, £15; second, £3. Four boats to start or no second prize.
7. **Senior Pair-oared Outriggers.**—Best-and-best boats. Distance, 1½ miles. Prize, £8.
8. **College Fours.**—Distance, 1 mile. Prize, A. R. Hislop and Co.'s Medals.
9. **"Pearce" Sculls.**—Distance, 1½ miles. Prize, £8 and Wolfe's Schnapps' Cup. The winner will hold the Pearce Trophy for one year. Entrance fee, 5s.
10. **Dinghies.**—For coxswains steering at the Regatta. Prize, Trophy, presented by Frank Moeller, Esq.

RULES.

1. Entries close at the Star Club Boat House, Wellington, on Tuesday, the 19th February, at 6 p.m., after which no entries will be received (See Rules for Amateur Regattas, Rowing Almanac, page 53.)
2. The entrance money shall be five per cent. on the amount of the first prize, except where otherwise provided in the programme.
3. The Union S.S. Co.'s Cup must be won twice in succession, or three times at intervals, before it can become the absolute property of the winner. The Cup shall remain the property of the Star Boating Club until it is finally won in accordance with this rule. (The Cup has been won once by the Union Rowing Club, of Christchurch, once by the Wakatu Rowing Club, of Nelson, once by the Star Boating Club, and once by the Wellington Rowing Club.)
4. The Pearce Trophy for the Sculls remains the property of the Star Boating Club. The winner is entitled to hold it for one year.
5. The "Young" Trophy must be won three times at intervals, or twice in succession, and in the meantime remains the property of the N.Z. Amateur Rowing Association. (It has been won once by the Canterbury Rowing Club.)
6. The Committee reserves the right to make any alterations, or to postpone the Regatta, should it be necessary.

BOATS.

Races Nos. 1 and 5 will be rowed in Inrigged String-test Gigs.
Races Nos. 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 9 will be rowed in best and best boats.
Race No. 8 will be rowed in heats in Fixed Seat Clinker Inrigged Practice Boats, to be provided by the Committee, and is open to *pupils only* of Colleges or Public Schools.
